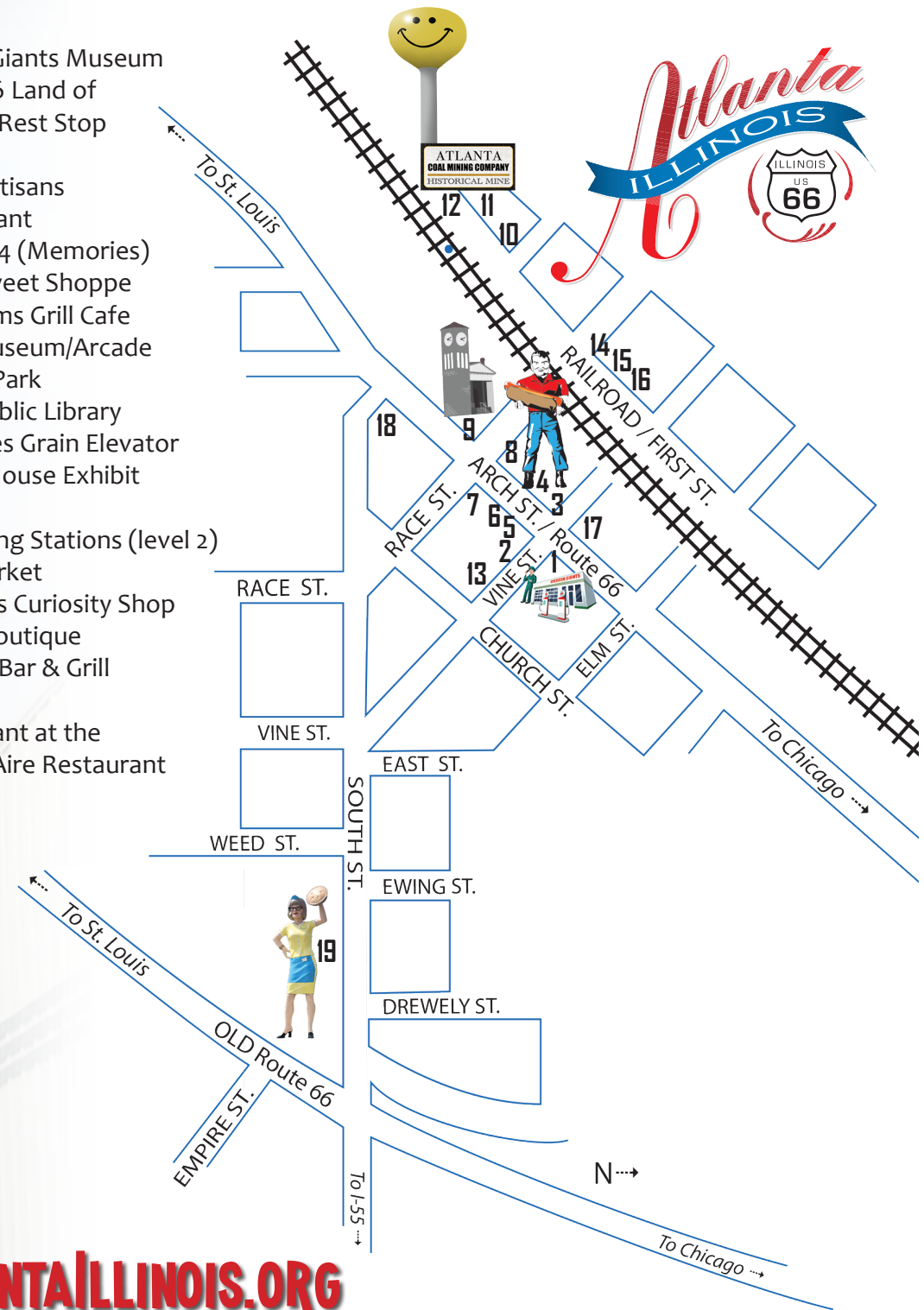

Attractions

1 American Giants Museum

2 & Route 66 Land of the Giants Rest Stop 100 NE Arch St.

Developed under the guidance of American Giant Specialist, Joel Baker, our museum tells the story of International Fiberglass Company and the “giant” phenomenon of oversized statues used to draw attention—and customers—to businesses across the U.S. Museum open April-September: Tues.-Sat. 10 a.m.-4 p.m., Sun. noon-6 p.m. October: Sat.&Sun. 10 a.m.-4 p.m.

5 The “Bunyon Giant”

107 SW Arch Street (old Rt. 66)

Take a once-in-a-lifetime photo of yourself with a 19-foot tall statue of a guy holding a hot dog.

9 Atlanta Route 66 Park

Corner of Race and Arch Streets (old Rt. 66)

Sit a spell, unwind, and enjoy the trees, flowers, and friendly folks you’ll find here. Then be sure to take some pictures of the mural in the Park and along Route 66.

8 Atlanta Museum

112 SW Arch Street, Ph. 217-648-2112

Find out how Abraham Lincoln and Route 66 helped shape this little town that time has nearly forgotten. Open Memorial Day through September Mon. - Sat. 10 a.m.-4 p.m., Sun. 1-4 p.m.

8 Atlanta Route 66 Arcade Museum

Misspend your youth all over again- one quarter at a time! Chock full of playable vintage pinball and video games from the 1930s-1970s. Located inside the Atlanta Museum.



10 Atlanta Public Library & Clock Tower

100 Race Street • Ph. 217-648-2112

Illinois’ only 8-sided public library building—built in 1908 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The clocktower was built in 1982 to house the 1909 Seth Thomas clock that adorned the former Atlanta High School building. Open Mon., Fri. & Sat. 10 a.m.-4 p.m., Tue. & Wed. 10 a.m.-7:30 p.m., Thur. 1-7:30 p.m.

11 J.H. Hawes Grain Elevator Museum

301 SW Second Street

Relive your Grandpa’s farming days at the J.H. Hawes Grain Elevator Museum. Check out the Scale House, Engine Shed, and Working Floor of Illinois’ only fully restored, wooden grain elevator. Open daily April through October, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.



12 J.P. Heironymus Carriage House

SW First Street

The last wooden carriage house still standing in Atlanta. Originally constructed in 1909 at 607 NW Vine Street to house the Heironymus family’s horse and carriage, it was relocated to this spot in 2019.

13 Atlanta Coal Mining Company Historical Mine

SW First Street

Discover the ironic story of Atlanta’s failed attempts to mine coal. Peer down into the lighted mineshaft, touch a large chunk of coal, and view a video of the descent down the mineshaft to recover artifacts. Open daily April through October, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.

Atlanta’s Historic U.S. Route 66/Illinois Route 4 Driving Exhibit

Corner of NE Arch Street and Sycamore Street

This quarter-mile stretch of circa 1924 Illinois Route 4 was redesignated as U.S. Route 66 in 1926. It is one of the few, intact, Portland cement, 18 foot wide alignments of original Route 66 road bed that has not been widened or covered over by other paving materials.
